



A CHORAL SERENADE

HE Jeffrey Cheah Foundation [JCF], together with Sunway University, hosted the fifth benefit performance titled Choral Serenade To Music at Sunway Resort Hotel & Spa in Sunway City recently.

The performance featured one of UK's leading collegiate choirs, University of Cambridge's Choir of Gonville and Caius College, accompanied by the Malaysian Philharmonic Orchestra.

Under the direction of Dr Geoffrey Webber, the choir took the audience of 1,100 guests on an enchanting journey through the centuries, buoyed by music from classical composers, such as Mozart and Franz Schubert, to contemporary greats, including John Tavener and Cheryl Frances-Hoad.

The performance also included a special tribute to Malaysia's musical heritage as the choir performed an arrangement of Malaysian folk songs, handpicked and deftly accompanied on the piano by Tunku Zain Al-'Abidin Tuanku Muhriz, trustee of the JCF.

One of the highlights of the evening was the presentation of a cheque worth RM300,000 — representing the proceeds of the evening — from the Founding Trustee of the JCF, Tan Sri Dr Jeffrey Cheah, to the president of the National Kidney Foundation of Malaysia, Tan Sri Dr Abu Bakar Suleiman.
