RM100,000 aid for NKF

Boeing says organisation a worthy recipient

HE National Kidney Foundation (NKF) was recently presented with a RM100,000 donation from the Boeing. Company to help needy patients undergo dialysis treatment.

Boeing's regional vice-president South-East Asia Datuk Paul Walters said the Boeing Company was convinced that NKF was a worthy recipient as the organisation carried out meaningful projects such as the Children Dialysis Fund.

The fund provides financial aid to those children who converted from Continuous Ambulatory Peritoneal Dialysis (CAPD) to Automated Peritoneal Dialysis (APD).

gone dialysis in the daytime, could now do so at night under the APD programme, thus allowing them to attend school and other extra-curricular activities in the daytime.

NKF chief executive officer Goh Seng Chuan thanked The Boeing Company and said NKF depended on public and corporate funds to keep its various programmes such as the Children Dialysis Fund and the welfare programmes running for the benefit of dialysis patients and to carry out its role as a one-stop centre for dialysis.
