

# More than RM30,000 raised for NKF

**T**O mark World Kidney Day 2013, Sri KDU International School raised RM30,647.50 in aid of the National Kidney Foundation (NKF).

Throughout March, students initiated various activities to promote the good cause.

They had earlier raised RM8,264 during Bazaar Day in December last year before the cause was adopted by the school council following a proposal from Violet Wong, 14, as their first big fundraising effort.

The balance was raised during Mufti Day and through the sales of cupcakes, NKF's kidney-shaped coin boxes as well as donations.

Competitions were held using the kidney-shaped coin boxes.

Students competed by creating the "best name" for the coin box and the "best decorated" coin box.

Prizes were also given to students who adopted the most coin boxes. Prizes such as two Blackberry phones were offered as a reward for the participants.
