

Donation to start the new year

Company gives RM32,000 to NKF to buy new appliance

PATIENTS at the National Kidney Foundation (NKF) Malaysia ushered in the new year with rays of hope thanks to a cash contribution from Utas Maju Sdn Bhd recently.

Spearheaded by its managing director, Adnan Md Noh, the company donated RM32,000 to NKF Malaysia for the purchase of a new dialyser reprocessing machine to be placed at one of NKF's 26 dialysis centres in Malaysia.

The machine is essential for the cleansing and sterilisation of the dialysers used during haemodialysis treatments which help remove excess fluids and waste for patients whose kidneys have failed and can no longer perform

these functions.

The team from Utas Maju Sdn Bhd visited NKF's dialysis centre in Petaling Jaya to further understand haemodialysis treatment for patients with end-stage kidney failure.

"We want to help those in need and look forward to providing more support to the underprivileged in the future," said Adnan at a cheque presentation ceremony at the NKF headquarters in Petaling Jaya.

NKF chief executive officer Chua Hong Wee said, "We are grateful to Utas Maju for this donation which will help kidney patients. It is heartwarming to know that we have many caring Malaysians," he said.
