"These initiatives are focused on

delivering education, healthcare, and community enrichment to those who need it the most, especially individuals in the B40 communities," he said.

To date, #SunwayforGood initiatives has impacted 404,901

Malaysians across the country and targets to improve one million lives by 2030.

In 2020, the group had sponsored RM1 million to setup the #SunwayforGood Anjung Kasih Yayasan Kebajikan Negara for the Hospital Seberang Jaya in Penang. The project provides temporary accommodation for family members from underserved communities who are accompanying patients receiving treatments at government hospitals.
